EYEGLASSES/CONTACT LENSES

All inmates/detainees shall be assessed during the intake process for eyeglasses and/or their use of contact lenses by a Correctional Police Officer and Medical staff.

Inmates/Detainees with Eyeglasses

- Plastic frames are permitted.
- Metal frames will be confiscated and retained in the inmate/detainees property.
- The inmate/detainee may need to remain in the infirmary based on assessment of their vision until a family member can provide plastic framed eyeglasses or they are scheduled for an Optometrist visit.

Inmates/Detainees with Contact Lenses

- They will be medically assessed in order to determine the persons need for the contact lenses.
- The inmate/detainee may need to remain in the infirmary based on assessment of their vision until a family member can provide plastic framed eyeglasses or they are scheduled for an Optometrist visit.
- The medical staff may need to consult with the inmate/detainees Optometrist in order to confirm a prescription.

Once on a housing unit, the inmate/detainee shall contact the medical department by making a request using the tablet system.

After they have completed all the internal assessments and processing, a family member will be notified as to when they can bring in the plastic framed eyeglasses.

The plastic framed eyeglasses must be <u>moderately</u> priced.

No name brand frames will be permitted. (i.e. Gucci, Prada, Versace, Coach, Fendi, Michael Kors, Oakley, Ray-Ban, etc.)
